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this quick 22 item screening tool is designed to help pre school professionals who may be concerned about a child s behavioral and emotional difficulties the pbcl provides an objective assessment of behavior and thereby helps to decide when intervention is necessary it is then possible at an early age to identify children who may be at risk of later developing serious behavioral problems
